This information is provided pursuant to and for the purposes of Art. 13 of the EU Regulation 2016/679 and the Provision of the Data Protection Supervisor dated 8/04/2010 on video surveillance in order to provide you with information regarding the processing of your personal data, following the use of video surveillance systems in the areas pertaining to ACQUATICA SPA – Data Controller – their use and your rights.

We inform you that video surveillance systems are in operation in the internal and external areas of ACQUATICA SPA's premises, and they are indicated by appropriate signs, in compliance with the specific provisions on the subject. It follows that access to, presence in and/or passage through indoor and outdoor areas pertaining to the company necessarily entails the filming and recording of images of you, personal data in respect of which you have the status of data subject within the meaning of the aforementioned Regulation.

Purpose of the processing and legal basis	The video surveillance systems were installed for the following purposes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Protecting the integrity of corporate assets within the limits and according to the provisions of the authorisation applied for and obtained from the competent Territorial Labour Direction For the exact location of the cameras, please refer to the plan available at the ACQUATICA SPA offices. The legal basis is the legitimate interest of the data controller pursuant to Art. 6 Para. 1f of the GDPR in compliance with your fundamental rights and freedoms and in accordance with the principles of proportionality and necessity, and your consent is not required. Acquatica Spa's legitimate interest is to defend the company's assets by preventing attempts at theft, robbery, damage and vandalism. The use of images for other purposes is not envisaged and in particular the purpose of remote control of work activity is excluded.
Categories of personal data processed	The personal data collected and processed by the video surveillance system are images of people and things that are within the range of the cameras. These images are processed exclusively for the purpose of protecting the company's assets and the security of the area by preventing the commission of any unlawful acts
Processing modes	Processing is carried out using IT tools . The plant is in operation 24 hours a day, seven days a week. ACQUATICA SPA processes personal data by taking appropriate security measures to prevent unauthorised access, disclosure, modification or destruction of personal data .
Recipients or categories of recipients of personal data	The data processed will not be disclosed to third parties. However, for the performance of the above-mentioned purposes the following parties may have access to the data: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Authorised personnel as defined in Art. 29 of EU Reg. 2016/679 - External parties appointed as data processors pursuant to the provisions of Art. 28 of EU Reg. 2016/679 - Public authority
Period of storage of personal data	The images taken are recorded and stored for the period of time strictly necessary to achieve the above-mentioned purposes: 72 hours . After this time, they will be completely deleted by overwriting them with new images Images may be processed for a longer period of time to comply with specific requests from judicial authorities
Place of storage of personal data	Personal data are processed at the ACQUATICA SPA operating sites and at any other place where the parties involved in the processing are located
Transfer of personal data to a third country or to an international organisation	ACQUATICA SPA does not transfer personal data to third countries or to international organisations
Fundamental rights of the data	As a Data Subject, you are entitled to the right of access (Art. 15) as well as, where applicable, to further rights including: right of rectification (Art. 16); right to be forgotten

subject and how to exercise them	<p>(Art. 17); right to restriction of processing (Art. 18); right to object (Art. 21); right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority (Art. 77).</p> <p>The right to update or supplement, as well as the right of rectification under Article 16 of the GDPR, cannot be exercised in practice in view of the intrinsic nature of the data processed (images collected in real time concerning an objective fact). The right to data portability as set out in Article 20 of the GDPR cannot be exercised, as the images acquired with the video surveillance system cannot be transferred to other subjects, except in the cases provided for by law and by this policy.</p> <p>The above rights may be exercised by sending an email to privacy@acquatica.net; ACQUATICA SPA undertakes to reply to you within 30 working days of receiving it</p>
Right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority	As a data subject, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the competent supervisory authority
Defence in court	The user's personal data may be used by ACQUATICA SPA in legal proceedings or in the preparatory stages of such proceedings to defend against misuse of the same
Existence of an automated personal profile, including profiling	Not applicable to ACQUATICA SPA
